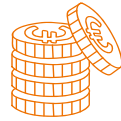

## Examples of donations



### De Decibellen (€10,000)

Stichting Eigenwijs connects people with intellectual disabilities and offers meaningful leisure activities. One of those projects is De Decibellen. De Decibellen is an orchestra with 37 musicians with an intellectual or physical disability. With nine volunteers and three supporters, they rehearse once a fortnight and put on around six performances each year. This is done with great enthusiasm and a lot of fun. The broad repertoire includes songs from local artists to the Beatles.



### White Collar Boxing (€10,000)

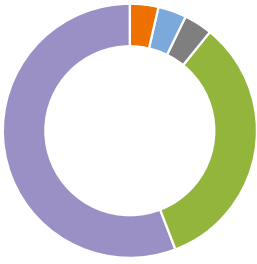
White Collar Boxing is committed to Lymph & Co, a foundation that supports groundbreaking research to improve the treatment of cancer in lymph nodes. About 1 in 50 people is diagnosed with this type of cancer during his or her life. In the Netherlands alone, around 4,000 new patients are diagnosed each year and this number is increasing. Through White Collar Boxing, people can participate in a real boxing match and collect sponsor money to support Lymph & Co.



### Sint voor ieder1 (€3,750)

For many children celebrating Sinterklaas is a matter of course. Unfortunately, this is not the case for all children in the Netherlands. The Sint voor ieder1 Foundation aims to give a Sinterklaas gift to as many children in difficult circumstances as possible. Because every child deserves a gift on 5 December!
